Founded in 2012 by a dedicated group of artists and community leaders, MoHA confronts the pressing issue of cultural displacement, offering a home for artists and creatives at risk of being driven out by the city's rapid economic changes.



#### Our Mission: Empowering Austin's Creative Heart

MoHA is more than an art space; it's a community-driven initiative committed to affordability, inclusivity, and accessibility. Our mission is to nurture a resilient creative community where each member is equipped to thrive, fostering well-being, prosperity, and self-determination.

## Diverse Leadership for Equitable Service

Community building, equity, and access are the cornerstone resources of MoHA's operating practices. MoHA's diverse 22-member guiding body ensures we serve our community equitably through art and music exhibitions, digital equity, online and in-person residencies, and professional development. In total, 75% of this public programming is free or less than \$5.

### Professional Support: Fueling Artistic Careers

Our professional support programs have been pivotal in preventing displacement of low-income and marginalized creatives. We've helped artists successfully receive \$1.4 million in grants to 140 first-time applicants. Our efforts have also catalyzed the founding of 72 nonprofits, small businesses, mutual aid and social justice organizations with sustainable infrastructure.
